FDA IS HIRING: EPIDEMIOLOGISTS

The FDA Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research (CBER), Office of Biostatistics and Pharmacovigilance (OBPV), CBER Surveillance Program (CSP) is offering an opportunity for an **Epidemiologist**.

CBER is responsible for regulation of biologic products including vaccines; allergenics; blood components and blood-derived products; tissues; and cell, gene and advanced therapeutics.

As a member of the CBER Surveillance Program Team, the candidate will work with OBPV and other CBER staff to identify key post-market safety and effectiveness questions to be assessed by the CBER active surveillance program called the BEST Initiative including design and implementation of observational studies.

MAJOR DUTIES

- A. Participate in design and execution of observational studies using large-scale health care data (administrative claims and electronic health records), interpretation of results, preparation of study reports and manuscripts for publication
- B. Utilize results of observational studies to contribute to regulatory decisions
- C. Participate in expanding the infrastructure and capacity for the BEST Initiative

DESIRED KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE

- **A doctoral degree in epidemiology**
- Proficiency in epidemiologic and statistical methods
- Strong analytical skills along with written and oral communication skills
- High level of interpersonal skills to interact and negotiate with many different stakeholders
- Experience or training in pharmacoepidemiology preferred but not required
- Applications will be accepted from all groups of qualified candidates, including U.S. Citizens. Non-U.S. Citizens holding valid immigration status and work authorization may apply for staff fellowship appointments.
